From shipping crates to paper bags, the logging industry supplies the raw materials for a large group of products. However, this is not without untold harm to the environment. It includes habitat loss, pollution, and climate change, with the effects spanning the globe from the rain forests of Central Africa, Southeast Asia, and South America to the northern forests of Canada and Scandinavia. The effects of logging extend beyond just the felling of a strip of trees. Nutrients, water and shelter for plants, animals, and micro-organisms throughout the ecosystem are also lost; many life forms - both terrestrial and aquatic - are becoming endangered as forests vanish.

Trees protect the soil beneath them; thus, tree loss can affect soil integrity. For example, the rain forest floor, home to a very large number of plants as well as insects, worms, reptiles and amphibians, and small mammals, relies on a dense branches and leaves at the top to keep it healthy and intact. Those prevent heavy rainfall to fall strongly onto the earth. Tree roots also give nutrients to soil and help prevent erosion. In return, a healthy soil encourages root development and microbial activity, which contribute to tree growth and well-being. A major factor in logging-related soil damage comes from road building, with trucks and other heavy equipment compressing the soft soil, creating furrows where water collects, and interrupting

the underground water flow. Eventually, the topsoil wears away, leaving behind a layer of rocks and hard clay.

Logging can also damage aquatic habitats. Vegetation along rivers and stream banks helps maintain a steady water flow by blocking the entry of soil, and tree shade inhibits the growth of algae. Removing trees causes many problems. When eroding soil flows into waterways, the organic matter within it consumes more oxygen, which can lead to the lack of oxygen in the water, killing fish and other aquatic wildlife.

After class, they sometimes stop at a cafe for a snack. On one occasion, Rita tells Jake, 'I think it's great how fast you pick up new grammar. It takes me a lot longer.' Jake replies, 'Yeah, but you don't seem to make as many silly mistakes on the quizzes as I do. How do you do that?'

In that moment, Rita and Jake stumbled across an interesting set of differences between older and younger minds. Popular psychology says that as people age their brains 'slow down'. The implication, of course, is that elderly men and women are not as mentally agile as middle-aged adults or even teenagers. However, although certain brain functions such as perception and reaction time do indeed take longer, that slowing down does not necessarily undermine mental sharpness. Indeed, evidence shows that older people are just as mentally fit as younger people because their brains compensate for some kinds of declines in creative ways that young minds do not exploit.

Just as people's bodies age at different rates, so do their minds. As adults advance in age, the perception of sights, sounds and smells takes a bit longer, and laying down new information into memory becomes more difficult. The ability to retrieve memories also quickly slides and it is sometimes harder to concentrate and maintain attention.

On the other hand, the ageing brain can create significant benefits by tapping into its extensive hoard of accumulated knowledge and experience. The biggest trick that older brains employ is to use both hemispheres simultaneously to handle tasks for which younger brains rely predominantly on one side. Electronic images taken by cognitive scientists at the University of Michigan, for example, have demonstrated that even when doing basic recognition or memorization exercises, seniors exploit the left and right side of the brain more extensively than men and women who are decades younger. Drawing on both sides of the brain gives them a tactical edge, even if the speed of each hemisphere's process is slower.
